Keats is remarkably a sensitive collector, organiser and transmitter of sensations, who tasted to the full, the beauties of the world and sought to increase them in his writings.

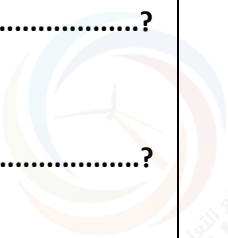
