Most houses use energy, but not this one. It uses virtually nothing: most of the energy that it uses comes straight from the sun, the wind or the ground. This is an experimental house at the University of Nottingham, and it could be the kind of house where most people are living fifty years from now.

During the daytime, it is rarely necessary to turn on an electric light. Sunlight is piped through the house through special high-reflection aluminium tubes. The house also has solar panels that generate electricity during the daytime, and a wind turbine power generator too; electricity from these can be used directly, or else stored in batteries, and used at night.
