

Present Perfect

- Form "Subject+ have/ has+ verb 3"
- Have is used with "I / You / We/ They"
- Has is used with "He/ She/ It"

- Use
- We use the present perfect simple to talk about situations continuing up to the present.
- Ex,
- I have studied French for three years
- Omar and sally have been married since 2010
- I have been at school for 7 years.
- Sami has enjoyed working as a Translator.

To make a question	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Have/ has+ subject + verb 3? - I have written five books. - Have you written five books? - Yes, I have/ No, I haven't. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - She has won the prize of the fastest runner this year. - Has she won the prize of the fastest runner this year? - Yes, she has/ No, she hasn't.

- Eat – ate – eaten

Adjectives

- 1- We use adjectives to describe **persons or things**
- 2- Adjectives describe **Nouns**
- 3- Adjectives are used with Verb to Be “**AM/IS/ARE**”
- 4- Adjectives can't be **plural**.

Ex,

- Omar is tall/ The UAE is attractive/ Students here are smart/
- This is a gargantuan complex. / Apple is a newfangled company.

Adverbs

- 1- We use adverbs to describe verbs
- 2- Adverbs describe Action verbs. All English words are action except “**am/is/are**”
- 3- Adverbs can't be **plural**
- 4- Most Adverbs are formulated by adding “**Ly-**” to the adjectives

EX,

Slow..... Slowly/ Fluent..... Fluently

Quick..... quickly

Easy..... Easily

He drives **slowly**

Most people in England speak English **fluently**

I passed the exam **easily**
