Say It Right: Using IPA in Dictionaries

a. Read and Learn



When you look up a word in the dictionary or glossary, you'll see strange-looking symbols next to it, e.g. /tʃɒp/. These are **IPA symbols** that show how a word is pronounced.

Examples:

IPA Symbol	Sound	Example Word	IPA transcription
/ɪ/	short "i"	bit	/bɪt/
/æ/	short "a"	cat	/kæt/
/ɒ/	short "o"	hot	/hɒt/
/tʃ/	"ch"	chair	/tʃeə/

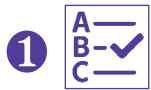
