The final famous disaster was in 1996 when a truck came barreling towards his car as he was driving around a mountain road. Selak was ejected from the car but he managed to hold onto a tree, and watched his car in horror plummet down. In 2003, two days after his 73rd birthday, Selak won the lottery in Croatia. With this, he bought a luxurious home, only to have a change of heart and sell it in 2010.
